

# The Community Mosaic Couch Trail

Adelaide Hills

Take a seat and be part of an inspiring story!

The Community Mosaic Couch project brought together locals in bush-fire affected communities in the Northern Adelaide Hills to make mosaic 'patches' that joined to form the 'quilts' that now adorn a trail of outdoor community couches.

As part of the Sampson Flat Bushfire Recovery program, some of the affected communities decided they would like to do a simple community project, giving locals the chance to come together, share stories and physically build something that would be an acknowledgment of their townships.

The Community Mosaic Couch project was born. Sites were selected and locals were invited to build a mosaic tile to help decorate their town's couch.

First was Kersbrook, with locals working together over a weekend, sharing skills and laughter, and creating a 'throw rug' for their couch.

Cudlee Creek was next, with so much interest from locals that enough 'patches' were created to adorn a picnic table as well as their couch.

Gumeracha, Paracombe and Houghton followed with a total of five unique town couches completed.

Sharing skills, stories and laughter, people of all ages worked side-by-side on the projects, creating a unique and fun focal point for their communities and a legacy that is testament to their resilience. Come and share in that spirit and enjoy a day out in the beautiful Adelaide Hills.
